## Public Health Nurse Services for Target Schools

Public Health Nurses (PHNs) work with schools to support the health and wellbeing of children and youth. As a target school, your school receives intensive PHN support.

## Your School's Public Health Nurse is available to:

- Assist in developing your School Improvement Plan (SIP) or School Annual Plan (SAP) health and wellness goals
  - These goals can be informed by the Child and Youth Health Atlas found at <u>www.hamilton.ca/ChildHealthAtlas</u>
- Support student, staff and community groups in identifying health priorities and develop comprehensive action plans to address the priorities.

PHN's can work with:

- o School-based Mental Health Leads and Teams
- Students and student groups such as Health Action Teams, Eco clubs, peer mentors, student senates and councils.
- o School Councils and other caregiver or community groups within your school
- Support classroom resources from:
  - o Public Health (e.g. Mental Well-being Guided Discussion)
  - o School Mental Health Ontario (e.g. Building Mental Healthy Classrooms)
  - o Psychology Foundation (e.g. Kids Have Stress Too!® Stress Lessons)
  - o PREVNet (e.g. Bullying Prevention: Facts and Tools for Schools)
  - o OPHEA
  - o And more
- Consult with Principals and Teachers on guidelines and policies such as:
  - o Safe and Accepting Schools
  - o Equity and Inclusion
  - o Food and Beverage
  - o Daily Physical Activity





- Co-facilitate Social Emotional Learning Groups
- Connect families and schools to community resources:
  - o Dental programs
  - Head lice clinics
  - o Immunization clinics
  - Sexual health clinics
  - Visual health services and supports
- Financial support
- o Employment services
- o Recreation programs
- School Nutrition Program
- o Other health care providers
- Support coordination of other Public Health school-based services as needed. These include:
