2.0 ABOUT

The City of Hamilton invites street, mural and graffiti artists or artist teams to submit an Expression of Interest to create a mural for the Keddy Trail Street Art Project. There are six (6) commissions available for small to medium-scale murals that include concrete barrier walls and seating along the trail. These murals range in size from 150 – 300 square feet.

An artwork proposal is not requested at this time. A citizen advisory committee will evaluate the applications based on the artistic merit of past work, expression of interest statement and artist biography. The selected artists will be required to develop a preliminary mural design sketch for approval prior to the mural paint days.

A second call has been issued as part of this project for a large mural located in the central plaza area located under the Jolley Cut Bridge Underpass. Please see www.hamilton.ca/keddyaccesstrail for details.

3.0 BACKGROUND

The Keddy Access Trail, named in honour of Jay Keddy was completed in 2020 and was facilitated by re-purposing a vehicular travel lane on one of the city's busiest mountain access corridors in order to provide a high-quality active transportation connection between the lower city and mountain. With a total distance of 2.7 km, the Keddy Access Trail spans between Hunter Street and West 5th Street, with side connections at four locations (including an entry point at Hunter Street and the bottom of the Claremont Access).

In addition to the barrier walls and seating, the Keddy Trail Street Art Project will feature a legal wall and a large-scale mural on the Jolley Cut Underpass Central Plaza. All commissioned murals will be painted over the course of 3-4 days in the summer (mid to late August, date TBD based on artist availability, weather dependent) and will culminate in a community celebration.

4.0 PROJECT GOAL AND THEMES

In 2022, a citizen advisory committee of local artists and trail users was convened to explore project goals and themes. Artists are invited to respond to one or more aspects of the project goal determined by the Keddy Trail Street Art Advisory Committee:

The Keddy Trail Street Art Project aims to create a sense of connection with residents about the idea of Hamilton as a Livable City.

The Keddy Trail serves as a thread linking elements of shared civic space, a literal line cutting through the tension of a growing city accessed by a broad range of citizens. The Keddy Trail Street Art Project commissions will address the sense of balance between the natural environment, cycling, pedestrian and vehicular infrastructure, the upper and lower city, diverse communities and people, on our journey to becoming a Livable City.

5.0 SITE LOCATION & DESCRIPTION

Six (6) murals will be painted at different entrance points located along the Trail (locations A1, A4, A5, A6, A7, A9 – see Figure 1 below)

Technical Specifications

- A6 is a series of 3 seating elements that will be painted and located in the Jolley Cut Bridge Underpass.




Figure 2: Example of Concrete Barrier Wall

- The remaining locations (A1, A4, A5, A7, A9) are murals that will be painted on the concrete barrier walls that separate trail users from vehicular traffic (see Figure 2 for example). These murals range in size from 150 300 square feet.
- The City of Hamilton will clean and prime the concrete barrier walls in advance of the paint days and provide barriers for safety while painting.
- The artist must provide all paint, materials and equipment required for the execution of the mural; it is expected that the mural be completed using high quality paints appropriate for exterior use.

Figure 1: Map of Keddy Trail and Artwork Locations

6.0 BUDGET

Depending on the size and location of the mural, successful artists will be awarded between \$2,500 - \$4,500 (excluding HST). Mural locations will be assigned the Keddy Trail Street Art Advisory Committee. This fee is the total amount available for all expenses related to this project. This includes (but is not limited to): artist fees, paint and materials, insurance, equipment, and travel. 25% of the fee will be provided upon the artist upon entering into a contract with the City of Hamilton, 50% following the submission and acceptance of concept drawing, and 25% upon completion of the mural.

7.0 ELIGIBILITY

This competition is open to all individual artists or artist teams. We encourage applications from artist-led teams or organizations that are engaged in a community art practice. Successful artists or teams must be able to travel to Hamilton, Ontario for the mural paint days at their own expense. This date will be scheduled in mid- to late- August depending on Artist availability (subject to weather). City of Hamilton employees are not eligible to submit proposals to this call.

Emerging artists are encouraged to apply. Artists under 18 years of age must have their parent or legal guardian sign all required documents on their behalf.

9.0 SELECTION CRITERIA

The Keddy Trail Street Art Advisory Committee will evaluate the Expressions of Interest based on the following criteria:

A) Project Goal and Themes

The Expression of Interest Statement is responsive to the competition goal and themes and is appropriate for the context and competition parameters.

Max points: 20, Min points to pass: 13

B) Artistic Excellence

The artwork samples provided display a high level of artistic merit within the artist's chosen discipline; artwork samples show innovation and creativity; originality of design; excellence in execution and artistic skill.

Max points: 20, Min points to pass: 15

C) Experience

The artist's biography demonstrates a demonstrate a high level of commitment to their chosen discipline and experience appropriate to the project scale and complexity.

Max points: 10, Min points to pass: 7

Mural Location Assignment

The Keddy Trail Street Art Advisory Committee will assign the mural commission locations to the successful artists based on the results of the above scoring criteria and considering the distribution of artwork styles and themes along the trail.

10.0 APPLICATION DETAILS

Applications are due by **9:00pm on Thursday**, **June 30th**, **2022** and may be submitted online via Submittable (submissions management platform). You must sign up for a free account in order to use Submittable

Please submit the following information:

1. Proposal Information

A) Application Information

- Name(s), AKA (artist pseudonym or collective name). If submitting as an Artistled team, please include name of participating team members.
- Contact Information: Address, Phone, and E-mail of Artist, Collective or Lead-Artist.
- Website (if applicable)
- Social media links (if applicable)

- B) **Biography:** A short biography outlining the relevant interests, experience and qualifications of the artist / artist team. Please specify experience related to creating artwork for the public realm and/or experience creating outdoor murals, street art or graffiti (250 words max.)
- C) **Expression of Interest Statement**: A short statement outlining the applicant's interest in the project and how they might approach the mural in response to the Project Goal and Themes outlined in in Section 3.0 (250 words max.)

2. Portfolio

- A) Artwork Samples: submit 3-5 images (maximum) of your artwork. Please note:
 - Images should be representative of your past work and do not necessarily need to include samples of murals and/or public art
 - All images must be in JPEG format, high resolution is preferred
- B) **Image List:** Tell us about your artwork samples. Please include: title of artwork, materials, dimensions, date and location of artwork (if applicable).

The City of Hamilton reserves the right to not award the commission to any artist and to cancel or re-issue the call at any time.
