To provide the opportunity for artists to create new artistic work and to enhance public exposure to a body of work that will build and /or strengthen their careers and/or enhance the creative profile of the city of Hamilton

# **HOW TO APPLY**

- Review the CEF General Guidelines and Creation & Presentation Handbook (available online)
- Create an account (Select 'individual') or login if you already have one
- Contact your Program Manager with any questions and / or to discuss your project
- Submit before the November 15<sup>th</sup> 4:00 pm

Artistic / Public Name & Legal Name (if different)





# WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

- Be practicing professional artists
- Be a resident of Hamilton (minimum of 12 months)
- Specialized training in their respective field
- Be 18 years of age or older
- Projects must be presented within the city \*
- COH employees must also submit a Confidential Code of Conduct Disclosure Form

### **Collectives:**

- Each member of the collective must meet the definition of a professional artist
- The majority of members must reside in Hamilton
- The collective is not required to be an incorporated body
- The collective will be considered either Emerging or Established based on its forming / founding year

Artists may submit an application as part of a collective and as an independent artist within the same funding year for distinct projects.



# WHO IS NOT ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

- Amateur / non-professionals are not eligible
- Full-time students are not eligible
- Managers, agents, curators
- Artists or collectives that have received funding in the previous year.
   (You may only apply in the second year after receiving a grant.)
- Projects that have been previously funded through the City Enrichment Fund





# **FUNDING + ELIGIBLE EXPENSES**

## **Funding Categories**

- Established Artist

   up to \$10,000 max
- Emerging Artist- up to \$5,000 max

## **Eligible Expenses:**

- Production / technical costs
- Studio / practice space rental
- Equipment purchases (max \$2,000)
- Travel costs (within Ontario)
- Residency costs\*
- Artist remuneration (Emerging \$2500 max; Established \$5,000 max)

## **Ineligible Expenses:**

- Administration, manager, agent,
- Expenses normally assumed by presenting organizations \*\*
- Public commission projects
- Completed projects or expenses incurred prior to funding submission
- Residencies that include academic instruction
- Fundraising- based projects are ineligible

<sup>\*\*</sup>E.g. shipping, marketing and advertising, publications, technical assistance.



<sup>\*</sup>Residencies cannot be teaching related, must be confirmed and must provide either financial or inkind contributions.

# WHAT DO YOU NEED TO SUBMIT?

Application

Artist Statement, Project Description, Project Plan, etc. (A copy of the application and is part of the Handbook!)

Budget

Budgets should be realistic, balanced, and represent diverse revenue streams. CEF will not fund 100% of a project's budget.

- Support Material + Support Material List
   Examples of your work (images, text, sound, video)
- CV (artistic resume)
- Project Specific Material (optional, up to 3)
   Reviews, articles, letter of support, album art, press packages, project timelines, etc.



# THE APPLICATION

Parts of the CEF application is shared among 7 Program Areas. Please note that where the application refers to: *Organization* that it is in fact referring to *Applicant /Artist* and *Program* references *Artist Project*.

- Artistic Statement
- Artist Bio
- **Provide a brief summary of your program** \* This summary is published as part of the public report. Follow the format provided in the Handbook.
- Provide a detailed description of your program (Approx. 1000 words)
- Consider providing details on the artistic elements AND the plan to execute your project
  - Project description, scope and goal
  - Project plan, timeline / schedule
  - Location (if relevant / applicable)
  - Participants / collaborators (team)
- Specify how funding will be used
- How does this program enrich the city? How will people experience your project?
- How does the proposed project advance your practice? How does this contribute to your artistic field(s)?

# THE APPLICATION – PROJECT OUTCOMES

Describe the outcomes of your program (Project Goals)

You are asked to identify 1-2 outcomes that you expect the project to achieve.

Consider: What are your goals? What is the impacts of your goals? Can they be measured? What are you trying to achieve with this project?

Outcome	Measure	Impact
Produce a new body of work.	<ul> <li>Creation of 5-8 new works that I can use to advance my practice.</li> </ul>	With this new body of work, I plan on contacting regional and provincial galleries to earn representation and / or secure 1-2 exhibition invitations.
Increase general audience to 80 (per performance).	<ul> <li>Audiences are an average of 60 people per show during the release of past work. I hope to increase my audience average to 80 people per show (#'s are captured at door.</li> </ul>	By focusing additional attention to marketing the release of this new album and securing shows at new venues I hope this new album increases my performing audience.
Publish novel	Solicit publishers XXX, XXX, and XXX and secure contract.	Securing a publisher would greatly increase the reach of my novel.
Screen short film	After completion of film (project proposal), receive XXX of invitations to screen film.	Proposals will be submitted to film festivals in Hamilton, Windsor/Detroit, Vancouver, Berlin which will spread awareness of my art practice internationally.



# THE BUDGET

Using the CEF Budget form online enter the projected (anticipated, planned) budget for your project.

- Revenue
- Expenses
- In-kind
- Brief Description point form

The budget notes are extremely helpful in explaining how well the project is planned, if there is confirmed / pending funds, breaking down artist fees, and providing additional information for the jury.

# **ADJUCATION PROCESS**

Applications are reviewed by a panel of peer assessors using the following assessment criteria:

#### **40% Artistic Direction**

- Strength of the articulated artists statement
- Artistic credentials and experience
- The overall quality of the plan, vision and goals
- Viability of the plan (realistic goals, appropriate planning, effective budgeting)

## **45% Project / Artistic Merit**

- Development of artistic practice
- Support material

## 15% Community and Creative Impact

- Contribution to the field, Hamilton's arts sector and the city of Hamilton
- Advancement of artist's practice







# **ADJUDICATION PERSPECTIVE**

The 3 person adjudication team is made up of experienced local and regional artists, representing various artistic disciplines.

- Be sure to include information that relates and supports the Assessment Criteria.
- Be very clear, using simple, direct language.
- Provide information on your artistic intent.
  - Why is this your next project?
  - Who are you collaborating with, why?
- Provide information on your project's artistic merit. What do you plan to achieve through your project.

# **APPLICATION TIPS**

- Read the grant program and guidelines carefully
- Contact the program manager to discuss your project
- •Draft, save, and edit your writing in a separate document give yourself enough time
- Use clear and direct language the adjudicators may not be artists in your field
- Prepare a well-researched budget, ensure it reflects the project you are proposing – don't forget the small expenses!
- Submit Support Material (examples of your work) that demonstrate your practice well and if possible, support the project you are proposing
- Get feedback from your peers and review your application before submitting
