The circulation in the park is isolated from Easthampton side and should be connected.	The large circular path can be safely used to navigate to all sides of the park.
The play equipment shouldn't be near the busiest street of the four sides of the park.	The proximity of the equipment to the street will be evaluated. The proposed playground is placed where the existing features are currently located.
Address swampy areas of park that flood and do not drain.	The grading and drainage will be assessed as part of the re- development works.
Basketball Court Feedback	
The basketball court looks too close to the playground and should be moved away.	The proximity of the basketball court to the playground has been considered and setbacks have been implemented between features.
Basketball courts are too noisy.	The noise from the basketball court has been considered; Setbacks from adjacent residential homes are implemented to reduce impacts from planned amenities.
Ensure that the basketball court has the ball hockey nets	The basketball court will have ball hockey nets included within the fence of the court.
Install a concrete ball wall.	A concrete ball wall was an option provided in the survey but was not a chosen favourite. The wall will be excluded.
Sun Shelters, Shade and Seating	
The park needs more shade, by adding more sun shelters, trees and shade sails.	Additional opportunities for seating in the shade will be taken into account while considering the project's scope and budget.
The park needs multiple sun shelters as community members loiter.	Neighbourhood parks are typically provided one sun shelter. Other locations for shaded seating will be examined further.
Birds take over and ruin the sun shelter area.	Disturbance from animals is a possibility in parks. This will be taken into consideration when evaluating sun shelter design options.
Add more benches and seating areas for both the playground area and the larger park area and include picnic tables.	More benches and seating areas in different arrangements will be considered as part of the park design.

Park Lighting	
Ensure there is lighting and seating in the sun shelter.	A light and seating will be included in the sun shelter.
Add more streetlights to stop crime.	A light standard will be installed adjacent to the playground equipment to provide more light at night and help to reduce unwanted behaviour.
Playground Equipment Comments	
Swings need to be included in the equipment, and there is a large need to add more swings to the park as there is never enough. Swings are needed in each area for junior and senior play.	Swings will be included in the playground equipment. The addition of more swings can be taken into account while considering the project's scope and budget.
Include accessible/ adaptive play areas.	The playground equipment will be built to meet National playground safety and accessibility standards (CSA Z614:20 Annex H) and will include areas for all children to play together.
Need to combine the play structures area so they are not separate.	The preferred playground layout in survey responses includes separated junior (18 month to 5 years) and senior (5-12 years) playground equipment.
There should be a separate playground area for junior and senior kids and multi-purpose play area in the middle.	The preferred playground layout in survey responses includes separated junior (18 month to 5 years) and senior (5-12 years) playground equipment with the multiuse court located
Equipment requests include monkey bars, rock climbing features, various styles of swings, climbing options, slides, zip lines, exercise equipment, ropes course, spin toys, spring toys, music toys, adaptive play and communication boards, store counter, and ninja course features.	All playground equipment requests will be taken into account while considering the project's scope and budget.
New Amenities Requests	
Add a splash pad.	Spray pads are not typically included in Neighbourhood Level Parks such as Lake Pointe Park due to their size, cost and supporting infrastructure needs.
Include an off-leash dog area.	Dog parks are not typically included in Neighbourhood Parks.
Build a calisthenics area in the park.	A calisthenics area can be taken into account while considering the project's scope and budget.
The park needs a soccer field/nets, a tennis court, and pickleball.	Sport facilities such as full-size fields are not typically included in Neighbourhood Parks. A single soccer net could be considered as part of the design if budget allows.

The park needs washroom facilities.	Lake Pointe Park is categorized as Neighbourhood Park and provides amenities that meet this service level; washroom facilities will not be included in the design of Lake Pointe Park.
A pump track and a skate park should be created.	Pump tracks and skate parks are not typically included in Neighbourhood Parks. A pump track and a skate park cannot be included as part of this project's scope and budget.
Create a convertible ice skating rink for the winter, that can be used to play outdoor ice hockey.	There are areas in the park that could accommodate a community ice rink however, this program is run through Volunteer Ice Rink Committees to create and maintain outdoor ice surfaces within designated parks during the winter months. Add a drinking fountain.	A drinking fountain will be included as part of the design.
Add bike racks.	Bike racks will be included as part of the design.
