# **Temporary Shelter Expansion – Overview**

Weekly Progress Update: January 20, 2025



The temporary outdoor shelter is part of the <u>City's broader</u>, <u>ongoing strategy to address homelessness in Hamilton</u>. This reflects Council's decision to provide <u>additional low-barrier shelter space</u> in response to the <u>Mayor's directive(PDF, 106.68 KB)</u> to establish a temporary outdoor shelter. This is not a standalone project but a crucial component of a larger system that includes <u>housing support programs</u>, <u>rapid re-housing</u>, <u>drop-in services</u>, <u>outreach</u>, <u>and emergency supports</u>.

**Activities:** 

### **Completed Last Week:**

#### Construction:

- First shipment of 10 units delivered on January 13, inspection/installation process commenced immediately. Next 20 units were delivered on the weekend.
- Initial installation of the first units on site, as well as safety testing for units to local standards. All units on site now propped up, and hardware being installed.
- Installation of power lines throughout the site to support unit connection.
- Internal fence installed / privacy mesh attached on interior/exterior fencing.
- Work on community building on site to meet operational requirements.
- Caroline St. Improvements: new Integrated Pedestrian Signal traffic signal at Barton St W and Caroline St N

#### Planned this week:

- Construction: final 10 units to be delivered to site on January 21; continued coordination of shelter unit installation, including: unloading and transfer with crane for installation; placement of units in designated areas on site; regular safety inspections; and electrical connections for each unit installed. Hardware installation continues (i.e. doors, handles, HVAC systems, etc.)
- Interior work on community building expected to be completed this week to allow for operator setup next week.
- Caroline St. Improvements: Temporary pavement markings placed due to cold temperatures and staff will return to install permanent pavement markings when weather permits.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> **Note:** largest challenge to date for agencies bringing new beds online has been staffing related, however all partners continue to work diligently to ensure safe onboarding of new shelter beds into the system as soon as operationally possible.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> **Note:** 50 additional beds initially projected to come online at Cathedral have been temporarily converted to up to 64 overnight drop-in spaces to accommodate additional need and capacity for overnight sheltering. These beds will transition to full shelter beds through January.
